BRUCE MEYERS

Bruce Meyers

Bruce Meyers grew up in Southern California during the early days of surfing, drag racing and hanging out at the beach. It was at Pismo Beach that he became acquainted with "dune buggies." These "water pumpers" were crude and heavy so Bruce took it upon himself to design a lightweight version that would be fun on the beach or in the wilds of Baja. After modifying a VW Kombi bus with wide rims (called "Little Red Riding Bus"), Bruce used his expertise in boat-building to design the first fiberglass-bodied dune buggy, the Meyers Manx.

After being featured on the cover of national automotive magazines like Hot Rod and Car and Driver, the Meyers Manx's popularity took off across the country. Over the years, Meyers produced more than 7,000 kits. In 2008, Bruce brought the first Meyers Manx Kick Out to this show for its east coast debut and, along with John Denmat of Denmat Cars, conducted the final assembly of the very first Manx Kick Out SS.

Bruce still operates Meyers Manx, Inc. out of his southern California

home along with his wife, Winnie. We are honored to have Bruce and Winnie with us again this year. Bruce is a true legend in the automotive hobby and many kit car enthusiasts credit Bruce for bringing the kit and replica industry to where it is today. Visit him in Building T.

The Truth About Motor Oil – Updated

This seminar will first focus on oil with some history, trivia, "Motor Oil 101" explaining zinc and a review of how and why oil specifications have changed over the years. There will be emphasis on the changes to "SM" & "SN" specifications in 2004 and 2010. For the first time in the history of motor oil in the U.S., the oil companies were unable to meet the EPA catalytic converter restrictions (150,000 mile warranty) with an oil that is suitable for older cars with flat tappet cams. The latest specifications have enough detergent to clean the "zinc" right out of the engine.

Autocross

The Susquehanna Region of the Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) and its Chapter Club, the Appalachian Sports Car Club, will conduct autocross on Saturday and Sunday. Each participant will get three runs of three laps against the clock. Scoring will be done on an overall basis using an index designed to adjust for the performance capabilities of the different cars. The experience is designed to allow you to test your performance on the course. It will also be useful if you want to learn more about your car's potential and your ability to manage



it. Instructors will be available to ride along and help you find new levels of performance.

Registration is required at the SCCA tent next to the track. The charge for each entry is \$25. When you register, you will choose a specific session. There are eight drivers per session. Check in at least 30 minutes prior to your start time for sign-in and safety inspection. Participants must be at least 18 years old and have a current driver's license. Helmets are required; loaner helmets are available. Registration closes when the sessions are filled.

Asian Cars: Efficient to Exotic

t could be argued that Japanese cars have had a greater impact on the automotive industry over the last 40 years than any other. Recently, Korean manufacturers, Kia and Hyundai, have been making some impressive vehicles but it was the Japanese that first raised the bar. There's no doubt that American car companies were forced to improve quality as a direct result of the competition from Japan.

The beginnings were humble, to say the least, with cars and trucks that were basic, reliable and efficient. In those days gas was still cheap and Americans were in love with big cars and thirsty V-8s, making the imports slow to catch on. As gas became more expensive and buyers started switching to smaller, more fuel-efficient cars, the Big Three looked for ways to keep pace. The early efforts nearly ruined Detroit's reputation for building cars.

American automakers made

numerous attempts to make their cars more efficient by lowering the power and adding an array of emissions systems. However, this made the cars even more sluggish and most of the emissions systems were complex and troublesome. Meanwhile, most Japanese cars were running efficient and reliable EFI systems on smaller engines in smaller cars. While this wasn't the recipe for performance, if you wanted some excitement you simply opted for something like a Z car, Supra or Rx-7.

Vintage Japanese cars have been popular for some time and for good reason. They offered a great platform to begin with. Car enthusiasts are always looking for ways to make the classics even better while some models are better left alone. This weekend you can see the whole gamut from stock to modified and from the newest to the oldest. If you want to see the oldest, just go to Building Y and see either of Daniel Banks' Datsuns, both of which are from the 1930s. For the newest, it's as simple as walking to the Asian section of the showfield.

We now live in an age where just about every company that sells cars in America is offering some serious performance. In the '70s, Japanese cars were considered "sporty" whereas today there are models that easily fall into the exotic category with the Nissan GT-R. Lexus LFA and Acura NSX. Subaru has one of the most popular modern "hot rods" with the WRX and the Mazda Miata has invaded SCCA events across the country. Even some of the most basic sedans have 300+ horsepower V-6s ... all while getting 30 mpg or more!

Just about all of the cars mentioned here can be seen this weekend. Building Y is home to some featured cars, the Paddock (in the Pavilion) has racecars on display and the Asian section of the showfield is loaded with Japanese cars. Hisashi Masui can also be found in that area.

"I made a halfscared phone call for vendor information and was immediately treated like the most important person in the world. Little did I know that Carlisle Events treats all their quests like the most important people in the world," noted Denmat.

During that initial phone call, Denmat mentioned the name Bruce Meyers. Event manager Ed Buczeskie knew the huge impact Bruce's participation would have on the kit side of the Import & Kit Nationals. With Ed's encouragement, John reached out to the dune buggy legend and invited him to the show. Bruce Meyers and the Denmat Cars display were a big success at the 2008 event. Since then, Meyers has attended many times and Denmat Cars has been here all but one year.

The Denmat brothers set up their display on Thursday and always enjoy reconnecting with other vendors, meeting new business owners and making new friends. John says one of his favorite things about the show is "watching the expressions from children when they discover a Manx for the first time. The excitement and interest in the vehicles we build is proof that what we do is worthwhile and keeps us coming back to Carlisle every year."
