



GLOSSARY

Admission for 2 & Parking	Single day admission tickets for two people and parking for one vehicle in a Carlisle Events parking lot (location varies by event).
Admission Ticket	Single day admission for one person. (This is for a guest/spectator, not for showfield.)
Anymotive	Designated vending area during Fall Carlisle where anything transportation-related can be sold such as motorcycles, ATVs, boats, etc.
Autocross (see also Drifting and Real Street Shootout)	A driving activity that takes place on the track. Autocross is where drivers navigate their vehicles through a mini-roadcourse, that is defined by traffic cones, in an attempt to complete it in as short amount of time possible without hitting any cones.
Automotive Flea Market (see also Swap Meet)	Vending area where goods or services are sold – must be at least 80% automotive. Most outdoor vending spaces are on grass and are 10 feet (frontage) by 30 feet (depth). Prices vary by event.
Awards	Awards are given to winners of various contests and showfield participants.
Burnout	An activity that is held at the grandstand. Requirements: the vehicle must be registered for the showfield, the owner must show their valid driver’s license and proof of insurance when registering at Guest Services.
Camping	Available at all events except Truck Nationals. RVs, travel trailers and tents are allowed. It is primitive/dry camping - no hookups. Two bath houses are available on the fairgrounds. Prices and locations vary by event.
Car Corral	Designated area where vehicles only (no parts, etc.) are for sale by individuals or vehicle dealers. All vehicles must be in running condition, cannot be on trailers and must match the event (i.e. a Ford may not be for sale at the Chrysler show but any brand may be sold at Spring and Fall). Carlisle Events is not involved with the sale of the vehicle. Most spaces are on grass, some are gravel and are 10 feet (frontage) by 20 feet (depth). Prices vary by event.
Celebrity Choice Award	Winners are chosen by celebrity judges. Applies to: Ford, GM, Chrysler and Corvette shows.
Celebrity Judge	People who are invited to the Celebrity Luncheon are Celebrity Judges. They choose a vehicle on the showfield to receive a Celebrity Choice Award. Their choice is based on their own criteria and the vehicle must not be chosen by another judge nor part of a special display. Winners of this award are included on the Winner’s List.

Celebrity Luncheon	An invitation-only luncheon held during the Ford, GM, Chrysler and Corvette shows. Invitees are asked to be Celebrity Judges (see above), they receive a meal and gift.
Chip's Choice Display	A display of Corvettes in Building T during Corvettes at Carlisle every year, usually fitting a theme. Named after Carlisle Events' late company co-founder, Chip Miller, who hand-picked the Corvettes for the display.
Chip's Circle	A type of Fun Field registration at Corvettes at Carlisle. Registered participants receive parking in a designated area, meals and tickets to the CMAF dinner (held during the event). There are a limited number of Chip's Circle registrations available.
CMAF	The Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation was formed when Carlisle Events' co-founder, Chip Miller, passed away from the little-known disease in 2004.
Cruise-In	Designated area at Winter AutoFest Lakeland (Florida) for participants to park their vehicle. There is no fee for the car and the driver, but passengers must pay daily admission. Cruise-In participants may attend one, two or all three days of the event.
Drifting (see also Autocross and Real Street Shootout)	A driving activity that takes place on the track. Drifting is a technique where the driver purposely oversteers with loss of traction while maintaining control and countersteering.
Event Pass	Admission for one person that's good for every day of an event. (Does not include parking.) Available to purchase at every ticket booth. For vendors and their staff that park outside the fairgrounds, free event passes are available only at the Will Call booth (beside Gate 3). Vendors are allotted two event passes for their first space and one pass for each additional space with a maximum of five passes.
Expo Center	The Carlisle Expo Center is a building located about a block outside Gate 3 at 100 K Street. It is a Carlisle Events property used for Carlisle Auctions and rented to outside promoters for their events.
Featured Vehicle Display	These vehicles are on display every day of the event in a designated area such as a building or tent. Some of the vehicles fit a specific theme or anniversary. To be part of the display, an application on our website (CarlisleFeatures.com) must be completed, then applicants are notified if their vehicle is selected. There is no fee to be in the display, and we provide free admission and parking for the vehicle owner and a guest. Credentials are available to participants upon arrival in the showfield office in the Registration Building.
Fun Field (see also Showfield)	Designated area at an event (Corvettes at Carlisle and Winter AutoFest Lakeland) for show car parking. Some areas on the Fun Field are reserved for clubs to park together but it is mainly non-reserved parking for all registered show cars. "Fun Field" was coined by Chip Miller, Carlisle Events co-founder, because he wanted everyone to have fun at a non-competitive car show.

Gate-N-Go Deadline	This is a showfield registration deadline for participants to receive their credentials in the mail so they can drive in the gate without stopping at the Registration Building. If someone registers after the Gate-N-Go deadline, they must stop at the showfield office and pick up their credentials before driving in the gate.
Guest	An individual attending but not participating in an event (i.e. not a vendor or showfield participant). Must pay gate admission and parking fee.
Guest Services (Building)	This building is located next to the Grandstand and contains the information desk, goody bag pick-up for showfield participants, registration for activities and contests, hand cart rental and more.
Hand Carts	Large, sturdy, metal carts to haul merchandise are available to rent at Guest Services. The borrower's driver's license is held until the cart is returned. Donations to the Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation are encouraged and appreciated.
IAC/Masland/ Lear Property	Several acres of land along the north end of Spring Road that is owned by Carlisle Events that is undergoing redevelopment. Homewood Suites is currently under construction with additional businesses and housing to follow.
Judged Showfield (see also Showfield and NCCC Judged Showfield)	See also Showfield Judging is done by a professional outside company based on certain criteria and awards are given to the first, second and third place in each judged showfield class. Registration fee is higher than Showfield. Winners are listed on the Winner's List. Import & Performance Nationals – Judged Showfield vehicles park on the showfield and drive their vehicles to the pavilion at their class's assigned time (times and classes are on the judging schedule). Truck Nationals – Judged Showfield trucks park in an area designated for their class in a section of the showfield. Corvettes at Carlisle – see NCCC Judged Showfield
Kids at Carlisle	This is a name given to activities for kids 12 and under. For some events, an activity center is in Building R where kids are welcome with parent supervision. It is not a childcare service.
NCCC Judged Showfield	NCCC = National Council of Corvette Clubs, Inc. Professional judging is available during Corvettes at Carlisle. It is in a designated area and called the NCCC 7-Sanctions Judged Showfield. Registration fee is higher than Fun Field.
Non-Judged Showfield	See Showfield
Participant Judging	During the Ford, GM and Chrysler shows, each person who registers for their vehicle for the showfield receives a voting ballot on which is a list of showfield classes. The

	<p>person is asked to vote for a vehicle in each of the classes. The three vehicles in each class that receive the most votes are listed on the Winner's List and receive awards.</p>
Parts Hauling	<p>Assistance in moving merchandise is available by calling 717-960-6429. A staff person is dispatched to pick up the individual requesting the service, then the merchandise is picked up and hauled within the fairgrounds (by golf cart, forklift or whatever is needed). Donations to the Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation are encouraged and appreciated.</p>
Pre-reg. / Pre-registration	<p>Pre-registering for the showfield by the Gate-N-Go deadline yields a price discount.</p> <p>Pre-registering for the showfield between the Gate-N-Go deadline and Friday the week prior to the event is not discounted, however, credentials (a showfield vehicle sticker and goody bag voucher) are prepared in advance and must be picked up beside the Registration building before entering the event.</p>
Real Street Shootout (see also Autocross and Drifting)	<p>A driving activity that takes place on the track. This is an autocross competition where the winners receive awards.</p>
Rear View Mirror Sunday	<p>The name given to Sunday when that day is included in the event (Spring, Fall, Ford, Chrysler and Truck). Reduced hours of 7:00am – 12:00pm. With a ticket stub from the same event, admission is free.</p>
Recycle	<p>Vendors that cannot attend but want to retain the renewal rights to their vending space can call Carlisle Events and Carlisle Events will attempt to re-rent those spaces. If the spaces are re-rented, 50% of the space rental fee is credited to the vendor.</p>
Registering to be a part of the Show	<p>See Showfield</p>
Reserved Fun Field	<p>A designated area of the Fun Field where Corvettes are assigned a parking space to use each day of the event. Registration fee is higher than Fun Field.</p>
Season Pass	<p>This is a punch card that is for daily admission for every event day for all of Carlisle Events show schedule. Does not include parking.</p>
Show Your Vehicle	<p>See Showfield</p>
Showfield	<p>A designated area to park vehicles that are registered for the showfield. The registration fee includes admission for the driver and a passenger each day of the event.</p> <p>For Ford, GM and Chrysler, the showfield is divided into classes which are marked with signs.</p> <p>For Import and Truck, see Non-Judged Showfield and Judged Showfield.</p>

	For Corvette, see Fun Field and Reserved Fun Field.
Showfield Awards	See Participant Judging
Product Listing	For each event, two lists of vendors are available in the event guide and on the free Carlisle Events smartphone app. One list is alphabetical and the other is by product, or category, of goods for sale. This listing makes it easier to find vendors who sell specific items when you don't know their name. Every vendor receives may list their merchandise under as many categories as they'd like, free of charge. The Product Listing Order Form must be completed and turned into the Carlisle Events office to receive a Product Listing.
Spectator	See Guest
Standard of Excellence	This exists only at the GM Nationals. It is a showfield class that provides professional judging and the fee is higher than the showfield registration fee. Awards are given to participants based on professional judging criteria.
Swap Meet	See Automotive Flea Market
Taxi Service	This is a service where people may request to be driven to another part of the fairgrounds by calling 717-960-6429. A staff person on a golf cart is dispatched to pick up the individual or people requesting the service, then they are driven to their destination within the fairgrounds. Donations to the Chip Miller Amyloidosis Foundation are encouraged and appreciated.
Temporary Pass	A temporary pass is required when someone needs to drive their vehicle from an outside parking lot onto the fairgrounds to pick up merchandise. To obtain a temporary pass, the person drives their vehicle to Gates 1 or 3, provides their driver's license and a \$50 deposit to a security staff person in exchange for a temporary entry pass sticker that is valid for one hour. License and deposit are returned upon exit.
The Oasis	Designated area with vendors selling health and beauty products, jewelry, handmade crafts and clothing, kitchen items and more. Location varies by event.
Track	An area at the northeast corner of the fairgrounds (beside the Turnpike, near Gate 5) used for driving activities such as autocross, drifting, Real Street Shootout, etc.
Trailer Parking	Designated area for vendors and showfield participants to park their trailer (used for hauling merchandise or vehicle) for the duration of the event. Prices and locations vary by event.
Vendor (see also Automotive Flea Market and Car Corral)	A person or business that purchases a vending space on the fairgrounds to sell their merchandise, vehicle or services in the automotive flea market or car corral.

Vendor Services	Office located in the registration building outside of Gate 3 during all events for transactions such as vendor registration and renewal and showfield registration.
Walk-In Pass	See Event Pass
Will Call	Will Call is a window in a ticket booth beside Gate 3 (in the parking lot). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Media credentials • Celebrity judge parking stickers • Event passes for vendors • Credentials are held here for pick up
Windshield Sticker	Every vehicle that enters the fairgrounds must have a sticker on the exterior driver's side of its windshield. Windshield stickers are valid for the entire event. The sticker indicates where the vehicle is to park. It also provides daily admission for two people. Vendors and Car Corral receive one sticker per space. Showfield participants receive one sticker per registered vehicle.
Winner's List	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Showfield • Celebrity Choice • Club Challenge This list is posted online and in front of the grandstand after judging is completed.
